Papers published in *Géotechnique* are eligible for awards from the Institution of Civil Engineers. Papers from any ICE journal can be nominated for several awards. In addition, each journal has awards dedicated to its specific subject area.

On Wednesday 1 November 2006, outgoing ICE President Gordon Masterton presented awards for the following papers published in *Géotechnique* in 2005. The advisory panel nominated their best papers and an awards committee chaired by John Burland allocated the awards.
