

Announcement: Award-winning papers in 2004

Papers published in *Maritime Engineering* are eligible for awards from the Institution of Civil Engineers. Papers from any of the ICE journals can be nominated for several awards. In addition, each journal has awards dedicated to their specific subject area.

On Tuesday 25 October 2005, outgoing ICE president Colin Clinton presented awards to the following papers published in *Maritime Engineering* in 2004. The editorial panel nominated their best papers and an awards committee chaired by David Hodgkinson allocated the awards.

The Overseas Prize (2), presented for the second best paper on an overseas project, was awarded to: Neville-Jones P., Swann L., Dou H. and Wai C. C. Minimising dredging for seawall construction in Hong Kong. *Proceedings of the*

The David Hislop Award, presented for the best paper on maritime, port, harbour, offshore or coastal engineering, was awarded to: Hamill G. A., McGarvey J. A. and Hughes D. A. B. Determination of the efflux velocity from a ship's propeller. *Proceedings of the Institution of Civil Engineers–Maritime Engineering*, 2004, 157, No. 2, 83–91.

The Halcrow Prize (3), presented for the second best paper on maritime, port, harbour, offshore or coastal engineering, was awarded to: Karambas Th. V. and Koutitas C.
