

HOWARD UNWIN, born in London on the 13th August, 1837, died at Monaco on the 26th February, 1911. Trained under the late Mr. John Wright, he was engaged for 7 years on railway and other work in Wales; 12 years, from 1868 to 1879, in the service of the Indian Public Works Department, engaged on irrigation, canal and famine relief works; and 20 years, from 1883 to 1903, as Managing Director of the Shrewsbury and Talbot Noiseless Tyre Company. He was a Justice of the Peace for Middlesex.

Mr. Unwin was elected an Associate of The Institution on the 5th December, 1865, and was transferred to the class of Members on the 19th December, 1876.

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CEDRIC VAUGHAN, J.P., born in 1841, died at Millom, Cumberland, on the 18th February, 1911. On leaving Edinburgh University he became an articled pupil to Robert Stephenson, Past-President, and subsequently served with the Midland Railway Company as Locomotive Superintendent of the Derby section. In 1872 he became Manager of the Hodbarrow Mines, being appointed in 1884 Managing Director, and in 1907 Chairman of the Hodbarrow Mining Company, a position which he held until his death.

Mr. Vaughan was elected a Member of The Institution on the 4th December, 1906.

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WILLIAM BUTLER WHITAKER, born at Nottingham in 1840, died at Blackheath on the 3rd February, 1911. Trained in gas engineering under the late Mr. B. Wheeler, of Nottingham, he successively held charge of gasworks at Bombay, Donnington Park, Belper and Buenos Aires, retiring in 1897 and returning to England in 1900.

Mr. Whitaker was elected an Associate Member of The Institution on the 5th December, 1882, and was transferred to the class of Members on the 5th May, 1896.

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JOHN EUNSON died at Northampton on the 4th April, 1911, in his seventy-ninth year. Trained under his father, a gas engineer, he was appointed in 1854 Manager of the Northampton Gasworks. Later he became in addition Consulting Water Engineer, and was associated with the late Mr. Thos. Hawksley, Past-President, in the
