

## OBITUARY.

GEORGE ATTWOOD, born at Carlisle on the 16th February, 1845, died at Steyning Manor, Somerset, on the 9th February, 1912. Trained under his father, the late Mr. Melville Attwood, he was subsequently engaged in the inspection of mines, and in survey and railway work on the American continent. From 1885 until his death he practised in London as a Consulting Engineer and carried out mining and other work in all parts of the world. He was a Justice of the Peace for British Columbia and the author of numerous scientific publications.<sup>2</sup>

Mr. Attwood was elected an Associate of The Institution on the 5th February, 1878, and was transferred to the class of Members on the 4th April, 1905.

KENNETT BAYLEY, born in October, 1838, died at Mirfield, Yorkshire, on the 24th June, 1911. Educated at Rugby, he served a pupilage to Messrs. Ransomes, of Ipswich, and later, to Mr. Robert Hodgson, of Newcastle-on-Tyne. Subsequently he acted as Resident Engineer on the Team Valley branches of the North Eastern Railway, and on various works for the River Tyne Commissioners. In 1877 he was appointed Engineer to the Great Southern and Western Railway of Ireland, and retained this position until 1900, when he resigned.

Mr. Bayley was elected a Member of The Institution on the 2nd February, 1875.
