

WILLIAM GREGORY KEAY, born at Greenwich on the 9th March, 1877, died at Wokingham on the 30th August, 1913. Trained in the Harbour Engineer's Office, Dundee, he was for a time an assistant to Mr. G. C. Buchanan, until appointed to the staff of the Harbour Engineer, Aberdeen. He next joined the staff of Sir John Wolfe Barry and Partners, and from 1909 until his death he served under the Commissioners of the Port of Rangoon, latterly as Executive Engineer for the river-training works.

Mr. Keay was elected an Associate Member of The Institution on the 13th January, 1903.

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SOPHUS SIMMELKJER, born at Helsingör, Denmark, on the 21st October, 1836, died in London on the 9th October, 1913. Having acquired experience of gas and waterworks engineering at Copenhagen, Riga and Moscow, he was appointed, in 1886, Engineer and Manager to the Cagliari (Italy) Gas and Water Company. He held this position until 1892, when he became a Director of the Company, removed to London and engaged in consulting practice, being Consulting Engineer to the Buenos Aires Gas Company and other similar undertakings.

Mr. Simmelkjer was elected an Associate Member of The Institution on the 21st May, 1895.

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RUSSELL TIPPETTS, born at Plymouth in 1874, died at St. John's Wood on the 17th August, 1913. He obtained his engineering training at the London and South Western Railway Works and with the late Mr. Jabez Church and Messrs. Santo Crimp and Taylor. Subsequently he was appointed Assistant Engineer to the Birmingham Corporation, and later was engaged on the sewerage, main drainage and waterworks at Vera Cruz for the contractors. He also carried out water-supply works in Columbia and railways in Brazil, and was last employed on the construction of a pier and wharf at Calabar.

Mr. Tippetts was elected an Associate Member of The Institution on the 3rd April, 1900.

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
