

JOSEPH WALKER SUTTON, born at Scotby, near Carlisle, on the 23rd September, 1854, died on the 6th April, 1914. After completing his apprenticeship with Messrs. C. P'Anson and Son, Whessoe Foundry, Darlington, he served successively as a draughtsman with the Mersey Iron and Steel Company, Liverpool, as a marine engineer in the Atlantic, and in the Crewe Locomotive Works of the London and North Western Railway. He was next employed on the construction of the Manchester Ship Canal and on the staff of Messrs. Willans and Robinson. In 1891 he entered the service of Messrs. Maw, Dredge and Hollingsworth, and at the time of his last illness he was employed on the technical staff of *Engineering*.

Mr. Sutton was elected an Associate Member of The Institution on the 7th December, 1886.

ALEXANDER WALKER, born on the 21st December, 1845, at Edinburgh, died at Ealing on the 13th August, 1914. Educated at Edinburgh, he was trained under Messrs. Wylie and Peddie of that city. Subsequently he was occupied on the construction of a bridge over the Dee at Kirkcudbright, and on bridgework in India and railway construction in Canada. In 1873 he entered the service of the Chilian Government, and was employed on the construction of the line from Santiago to Concepcion and on the Frontier lines. In 1887 he was engaged by the Arauco Company on the survey and construction of their line, afterwards remaining as Resident Engineer and Traffic Manager, which position he retained until his retirement in 1908.

Mr. Walker was elected an Associate Member of The Institution on the 4th December, 1888.

JAMES FITZGERALD WINDLE, born at Tarbert, Co. Kerry, on the 16th December, 1870, died at Tipperary on the 17th April, 1914, as the result of a motor-car accident. He was educated at Queen's College, Cork, and afterwards acted as Assistant Engineer on the Cork, Bandon and West Coast Railway, under Mr. John R. Kerr. In 1894 he was appointed Assistant County Surveyor of Limerick, under Mr. J. Horan, M. Inst. C.E., and after twelve years' service was transferred to the Irish Board of Works. At

the date of his untimely death he was acting as District Inspector of Public Works at Tipperary.

Mr. Windle was elected an Associate Member of The Institution on the 1st December, 1896.

SIR EDWIN DURNING-LAWRENCE, Bart., died at his residence in Carlton House Terrace, on the 21st April, 1914, in his 78th year. Trained under his father, the late Mr. William Lawrence, he later became a member of the firm of William Lawrence and Sons, builders and contractors, which was associated with the construction of a number of large buildings and public works. Sir Edwin was created a baronet in 1898, when he took the additional name of Durning, and from 1895 until 1906 he represented Truro as a Liberal-Unionist in the House of Commons. In later years he interested himself chiefly in the Bacon and Shakespeare controversy, taking up the position of an ardent Baconian.

Sir Edwin Durning-Lawrence was elected an Associate of The Institution on the 7th December, 1869.
