

HERBERT THOMAS ALLEN, born in India on the 10th March, 1883, was killed in action in France on the 25th September, 1915. He gained his early experience in mechanical works and on the staff of the North Staffordshire Railway. Between 1906 and 1914 he was employed successively on the construction of the Shire Highlands Railway, Nyasaland, the Sutlej Valley Railway, India, and as District Engineer on the Trinidad Railways. On the outbreak of war he accepted a commission, first in the Royal Naval Reserve, and later in the 9th Battalion Seaforth Highlanders, being shortly afterwards gazetted captain. He was elected an Associate Member on the 3rd February, 1914.

HENRY CHARLTON AMOS, born at Newcastle-on-Tyne in 1882, was killed in action at the Dardanelles on the 21st July, 1915. Previously to obtaining a commission in the Corps of Engineers attached to the Royal Naval Division, he had been associated with the Charing Cross, Euston, and Hampstead railway contract, railway construction in Peru, surveying in Bolivia, and Buenos Aires harbour works. He was elected an Associate Member on the 5th April, 1910.

WILFRID HOCART BISHOP, born at St. Peter Port, Guernsey, in 1877, died there on the 30th April, 1915. After serving a pupillage to Mr. A. T. Walmisley, M. Inst. C.E., he became an assistant to Mr. David Gravell, M. Inst. C.E., and subsequently served on the staffs of the Metropolitan and the South-Eastern and Chatham Railways. In 1902 he was appointed to the staff of the Sudan Government Railway, and was employed on the construction of the Suakim line and Khartum station until 1910, when he became Agent at Alexandria, resigning later on account of ill-health. Mr. Bishop was elected an Associate Member on the 12th January, 1904.

GEORGE TOWNSHEND BROOKE, born at Haughton Hall, Shifnal, on the 9th May, 1878, was killed in action in France on the 6th May, 1915. On leaving Coopers Hill in 1899, he joined the Irrigation Service of the Egyptian Public Works Department. He was employed on the Zifta barrage and other works, and in 1912 was promoted Inspector of the Third Circle at Alexandria. Returning home on sick leave in 1913, he was in England on the outbreak of war. Mr. Brooke was elected an Associate Member on the 3rd December, 1907.

LEONARD BURRELL, born at Cheltenham in 1860, died at Auckland, New Zealand, on the 27th August, 1914. In 1876 he was articled to Messrs. Gotto and Beesley, engineers and contractors, of Westminster, and was subsequently engaged on their drainage and improvements contracts at Rio de Janeiro. He was afterwards employed on contracts at Horsham, Chatham, and Brentford, and in 1887 he returned to Rio, remaining there, employed on the City Improvements, until 1910, when he retired in ill-health. Mr. Burrell was elected an Associate Member on the 6th April, 1886.
